ABOUT THE HEARING | April 10, 2025

Presentation: 6 p.m.

Hearing: 6:30 - 7:30 p.m. (meeting may be extended if the number of speakers warrants)

- The meeting platform being used is Zoom.
- The public may provide verbal comments following the presentation. Comments that are made publicly through online tools must follow our UDOT Social Media Policy Participant Code of Conduct. Participants who violate that policy may be removed at the moderator's discretion.
- The hearing will be recorded as part of the study record and will be available to view on the study website.

BEFORE THE HEARING

- All speakers are asked to register to speak in advance of the hearing on the form posted on the study website.
- Please ensure the name you register with is the same as your Zoom meeting name. This is how you will be identified to speak.
- Individuals without internet access or needing accommodations including but not limited to translation, captioning, reviewing materials, or submitting comments should notify our team via phone or email by April 1, 2025, for assistance with the public hearings and April 21, 2025, for assistance with making a comment.

JOINING THE HEARING FROM A COMPUTER OR AN APP

- Ensure you have either speakers or headphones to listen to the hearing and that your microphone works if you wish to comment.

MAKING A COMMENT

- Click the "Raise Hand" button to identify yourself, and a host will temporarily promote you to a panelist.
- Press *9, and the moderator will call on you when it is your turn.

DURING THE HEARING

- Following the presentation, the public is invited to make verbal comments.
- Only panelists and commenters will be allowed to speak, all attendees will be muted unless it is their turn to speak.
- Registered commenters will have the first opportunity to speak, followed by those who did not register but wish to speak.
- Speakers will be called in the order they registered and then in the order the request is received during the hearing. When it's your turn to speak, your name will be called. Speakers may turn on their own video when commenting if desired.
- All public comments during the hearing will be limited to three minutes per speaker, so we can accommodate as many speakers as possible.
- Comments made during the hearing will not be responded to during the hearing. All comments provided during both hearings and the comment period will be recorded. Responses will be provided in the Final EIS.
